>>> ITS A NEW BEGINNING

During the past three months, we closed our center in Nairobi, as we focused on relocation before we start the September intake. Despite the closure, we remained active in various ways:

Land acquisition: Together with the board members, on 29th May 2024 we were able to acquire a piece of land where we will build our new center. The land is located in Konza, Kajiado country 86 km from Nairobi city.

Apprenticeship: Our apprenticeship program, which took place on April 8, 2024, was successful with 100% internship placement for the outgoing 13 beneficiaries.

Outreach Programs: Recently, we participated in a meeting organized by the Caritas group in Machakos town. The focus was on combating drug use among youth, and our course received significant interest from the attendees.

TWAJALI TRAINING CENTRE SET UP

>>> PRELIMINERIES

Now that we have acquired 10 acre piece of land, we plan to immediately utilize existing materials and equipment from our previous institution to set up temporary structures. This will allow us to swiftly resume our training programs in a conducive environment, ensuring minimal disruption. While the initial focus will be on temporary facilities, the subsequent phases will involve the construction of permanent infrastructure. the land development will be divided into 4 phases, Academic block (3 acres), Training Hotel Model (3 acres), Staff accomodation (1 acre) and Twajali Farm (3 acres)

>>> ACADEMIC BLOCK

This will include

- Multipurpose Hall- to serve as the primary training space and host various functions.
- Kitchen: - big enough will accommodate two sessions— a demonstration kitchen and a practical training kitchen.
- Administration Block- a three-story building housing five offices, a common staff room, and a rooftop terrace.
- Accommodation Rooms: - inspired by Maasai traditional houses (manyatas),
